Since WIP's founding in 2003, we have built an endowment of more than \$1 million. We have also awarded more than \$921,000 in grants to nonprofit organizations throughout Beaufort County.

#### WHY WIP?

Many of us have connections with our favorite nonprofit organizations, but by pooling some of our resources we can make a significant impact on addressing specific community needs. As members of WIP we:

- Fund an endowment, ensuring continued community support far into the future.
- Participate in selecting a new grant theme for each year.
- Benefit from a grants committee to ensure that the grant requests meet the requirements of the designated theme, and that the nonprofits are able to effectively use and account for the funds.
- Learn about and enjoy group visits with nonprofits receiving support from Women in Philanthropy.
- Experience how the shared value of generosity brings people of all races, faiths and political views together.
- Join committees to more closely engage with other members and the organization, or choose to be a silent member whose participation is limited to making an annual contribution.

### GRANTMAKING

WIP's grantmaking focus is on strengthening families and individuals in the areas of health, human services, community development, education, the environment, and arts and culture.

The fall luncheon program gives members an opportunity to expand their knowledge on the newly adopted theme. Applications submitted by nonprofit organizations are then reviewed by the grants committee so that, through careful vetting and accountability in reporting, we can be sure the organizations that receive WIP grants will be able to 'move the needle' on specific targeted issues.

The proposals selected are submitted to the advisory board for approval. New grants are awarded at the spring member luncheon, and prior-year grant recipients report on the impact of our grants in the community.
